On Friday 21st March Reception will be going to The Atkinson to see The Very Hungry Caterpillar Show.

The production faithfully adapts four stories by author/illustrator Eric Carle: Brown Bear, Brown Bear, 10 Little Rubber Ducks, The Very Busy Spider and of course, the star of the show – The Very Hungry Caterpillar. The Very Hungry Caterpillar has delighted generations of readers since it was first published in 1969 selling more than 48 million copies worldwide. Brown Bear, Brown Bear – now celebrating 50 years – has sold more than 18.2 million copies. The Very Hungry Caterpillar Show is a vibrant celebration of Eric Carle's adored classics and the perfect introduction to live theatre.

This trip will be a wonderful way for the children to experience live theatre and is part of ongoing work in Literacy and Understanding of the World. We will be completing a mini project in class based on the story.

Trip details

- **Friday 21st March:** the trip takes place during the school afternoon
- **Cost: £19.50:** to be paid by Friday 14th March
- **Clothes:** children can wear their own clothes as it is Red Nose Day & we will wear our green caps
- **Food:** children will eat lunch in school as normal when they return
