Maths

This week in maths, we have been focusing on recognising tens and ones in two-digit numbers. We have been using different maths equipment to make numbers in words and in numerals. This deep number knowledge will really support your child when we move on to other concepts in maths. It's important that they have a secure knowledge of what each digit represents in a 2-digit number and they can partition those numbers in to tens and ones.

There is a great game that you can play to help practise these skills – click on TO (not HTO) and try to make the numbers using number words and numerals.

Please continue to listen to your child read as much as possible this week. We recommend little and often - 5 or 10 minutes as many days as you can. If your child is taking a while to 'Fred talk' and read a word, remember to ask them to repeat each sentence, then each page several times before moving on the next page. This will improve both their reading skills and their confidence. It will also ensure that they understand what they are reading, rather than rushing to finish the book but not being able to recall anything they have read.

Reading books to your child is also an extremely valuable experience. Through stories they can make sense of the world.
