As mentioned earlier this year, at the end of every half term we assess the children on their reading and spelling of the Year 1 and Year 2 common exception words.

Next week, we will carry out these assessments. For spelling practise this week, continue to take some time to practise these common exception words. You should already have a copy but please ask if you have misplaced it.

We suggest that you choose 10 of the spellings that your child is unsure of.

We do not expect that your child can read and write them all yet. Year 2 words are a target to be achieved by the END of Year 2.

Start practising Year 1 common exception words and only move on to Year 2 common exception words if your child is secure with Year 1.

For children who are confident reading and spelling all Year 1 and 2 words, we have included a list of Year 3 and 4 words.
